WE SUPPORT THE MIGRANT AND REFUGEE



Refugee Resettlement Program

Resettled **270 refugees** from Iran, Iraq, Syria and Afghanistan in 2017



Esperanza Immigrant Rights Project

Provided **1,460 high quality legal services** to **1,251 immigrants** last year, especially children, the poor, and those needing mental health services





St. Vincent de Paul at 143 parishes

Serving over 220,000 people

Emergency housing, motel vouchers, transportation vouchers, rental assistance, furniture, clothing and personal needs, food pantries and more



Catholic Charities of LA

Serving over 250,000 people

Provided over **900K services (including 500K meals)** this year mainly to women and children, most of whom have a family income of \$20,000 annually or less



St. Francis Center in Downtown LA

Serving over 100,000 people

Including over **129K meals and over 18K food pantry visits** for families. In addition, provided 480 youth overnight, weeklong, day camps and enrichment activities



More than 77 individual parishes

Serving over 12,000 meals a year

Parishes offer food distribution through food pantries, with a few also providing hot meals, ranging from once a month to daily



WE SHELTER THE HOMELESS



Covenant House

Provided over 45,000 nights of housing

For homeless and trafficked youth and other support to **1,827 youth** in 2017 across California



Good Shepherd Center for Homeless Women and Children

Served over 1,200 people

With emergency shelter, transitional residences, drop-in and mobile outreach programs for women and families, employment skills development with a residence for 9 mothers and 21 children



East San Gabriel Valley Coalition for the Homeless

Housed and feed 200+ people at 5 parishes

Each night from December to February annually



St. Margaret's Center

Placed 85 people

Into **permanent housing**. Offers an emergency shelter for single men as well as street outreach, drop-in day center, and social services



St. Vincent de Paul Los Angeles

Placed 200 individuals and families

Into **permanent housing** in LA, Ventura and Santa Barbara Counties last year



House of Ruth

Serving over 180 women and children

Through an emergency women's shelter with 80 beds
