1. HEAR

2. PRAY

In today's gospel, even though it may seem unfair that the workers who worked less got paid the same, Jesus uses this gospel to help us understand God's generous love.

Children: Talk to Jesus and ask him to help you see the people who have shown you generous love. Write down the names and pray for them this week.

Share with us how you are living out your faith at home. Use #LACatholicsBelieve and tag @LACatholics on social media.

Teenagers: Talk to Jesus and ask him to help you see the people who have shown you generous love. Identify 1 person and reach out to say thank you. (Get creative: video, text, card, phone call, post card, etc.)

Young Adults: Talk to Jesus and tell him of a time that you felt angry with Him and the situation was unfair. Ask Jesus to help you find His generous love in that situation.

Adults: Talk to Jesus and share with Him a time where you have felt that you had to earn His generous love. Ask Jesus to help you accept that His love is freely given.
