BENEDICTION

After a period of meditation and reflection the celebrant goes to the altar, genuflects, and kneels. All kneel and join in singing the Tantum Ergo.

Priest/Deacon: *You have given them Bread from heaven* (P.T. Alleluia)

ALL: **Having all sweetness within it** (P.T. Alleluia)

Priest/Deacon: *Let us pray! O God, who in this wonderful Sacrament have left us a memorial of your passion, grant us, we pray, so to revere the sacred mysteries of your Body and Blood that we may always experience in ourselves the fruits of your redemption. Who live and reign with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.*

ALL: **Amen.**

*The celebrant will then bless all present with the Eucharist.
After the presider has blessed everyone, he will come back in front of the altar and kneel
and lead everyone in the **Divine Praises.***

REPOSITION

When the priest or deacon has blessed everyone he then replaces the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle and genuflects, all stand and join in singing.
