COVID-19 6 Month Snapshot March - October 2020

Our ministries work together seeking the common good and well-being of all especially the poor and vulnerable. Our faith gives us a greater sense of responsibility, a strong call to community and a deep love for our brothers and sisters. Through our programs and agencies, we have answered the needs of families during the COVID-19 pandemic.



CCHD (CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT)

CCHD Kindness grants provide support to parishes and assist community partners.

TOTAL GRANTS GIVEN:

\$169,222

Has been distributed to over 30 parishes, food banks, and community partners providing direct services to support families and individuals in need.





262 SCHOOLS

Serving 73,711 students grades pre-kindergarten through twelfth grade

- All schools transitioned to distance learning within 72 hours
 — we NEVER stopped teaching! Over 26K iPads have been distributed and as a result, there was no disruption in learning when children began to distance learn.
- Raised over \$6 million to support Catholic schools and families in need since the start of the COVID-19 crisis.
- 7,500 pieces of sports equipment have been donated by the LA84 Foundation and distributed to our poorest schools to support physical play.



DEVELOPMENT

COVID-19 Relief Fund raised nearly **\$300,000** including \$126,000 from 150 clergy and more than \$170,000 from 665 laity.



Served over **1 million** meals at 60 school sites to needy students, without reference to faith or connection to our schools, from April 2020 - September 2020.


402 showers and 1,420 hygiene kits for homeless individuals

HEARTS TO SERVE

On March 23rd, 2020, the Archdiocese of Los Angeles launched the Hearts to Serve Hotline in response to the global crisis caused by the COVID-19 Pandemic. Over **1,800** individuals served as of October 1st, 2020 with direct service to over **900** individuals and families with referrals to:



Through the Cardinal McIntyre Fund, the Hearts to Serve program provided **\$20,000** in financial assistance to families in need with utility, food, and rental assistance.



CATHOLIC CHARITIES OF LOS ANGELES, INC.

Through the agency's many programs, Catholic Charities provides assistance to families in need. Food Distribution Services during March-May 2020 58,561 clients served and 61,263 services.



CARDINAL MCINTYRE FUND

- Over 350 individuals/families were assisted through the Cardinal McIntyre Fund.
- Between April 1 and October 1, 2020, a total of \$400,000 was given to parishioners whose jobs were lost or furloughed as a direct result of the pandemic. Hearts to Serve distributed funds to a number of parish pantries to help replenish their food supplies. Cardinal Mcintyre received online donations, specifically to help with COVID-19 efforts, totaling \$105,000 and a \$20,000 grant from the Catholic Campaign for Human Development.



HEALTHCARE / HOSPITALS

Providence has **6** Catholic hospitals in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles.

2,334 COVID-19 patients served in Providence Hospitals in LA County from February 2020 - August 2020.



- The St. Vincent de Paul Council distributed over \$52,000 in financial assistance and provided \$16,500 worth of clothing and furniture to families in need.
- The Cardinal Manning Center provided 10,125 meals to individuals on Skid Row
 - Provided 15,000 pieces of Personal Protection Equipment to residents and individuals on Skid Row
- 136 Conferences of Charity of SVDP from April 2020 to September 2020
- Conferences Provided \$300,000 in direct assistance for utilities, medical expenses, and other needs
- \$190,000 in Rental/Mortgage assistance
- \$300,000 in Food assistance



MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID TRAINING

 Trained 300 lay ministers in Psychological First Aid to provide assistance and resources to parishioners in need with the UCLA Hispanic Neuropsychiatric Center of Excellence and in partnership with the LA County Department of Mental Health.



OFFICE OF RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

- Provides faith formation to over 102,094 people, Pre-K to Adult.
- Forms and accompanies over 900 Parish Catechetical Leaders to lead virtual formation.
