1. HEAR

2. PRAY

Together pray and reflect on the commandment: "Love one another as I have loved you." Quietly reflect on how you show love to others – at home, with your family, your friends?

Together pray and reflect on Jesus saying to his disciples: "I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing." Quietly reflect on how you extend your love and actions of love (being a good friend, being kind, being of service to others) – how am I the branches of Jesus' vine – extending out to others loving actions everyday.

3. TALK

Go on a nature walk. With each step, look around you at all the beautiful trees. Notice how each tree and its leaves are different, unique, and beautiful. If you see a leaf on the ground during your walk, pick it up and examine it closely. Notice the different shades of green, yellow, orange, or red – see it's unique texture and shape.

Reflect on the beauty of creation, God's gift to you. Imagine God as a massive vine and you are one of His unique and beautiful leaves.
