Become a CASA

Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) are trained volunteers who work-one-on-one with children and youth. They represent and advocate for them in the dependency court system. CASA's make a life-changing difference in the life of a child while helping make decisions that are in the child's best interest.

Many organizations lack resources and are always looking for volunteers to help with programs and events. Volunteering is also a great way to meet and learn about the needs of foster children first hand. This can help to identify your calling.

Organize a drive

Foster youth often lack basic necessities. Organizing a drive to collect practical items such as jeans, pajamas, socks, backpacks, or luggage to carry their belongings is a great way to get students involved and teach them about foster care.

Involve the family

Send flyers home with students to encourage family discussions. Encourage participation of families in activities such as a drive, volunteer for a day or attend a school foster care presentation.

Learn More

Invite a speaker to talk with your students and parents about fostering. Hearing the testimonies of foster parents and when possible, youth will help give a better understanding of foster care and how families in your parish can help.
