4.5 million Catholics, 287 Parishes, 265 Schools


HIGHLIGHTS:

- More than \$10,000,000 used to help families in need in Los Angeles, Ventura and Santa Barbara counties
- Served more than 460,000 individuals/families
- Provided 3,900,000 social services
- Provided virtual formation to 114,000 individuals
- 180,000 Masses celebrated live-stream and in-person, indoors and outside, in more than 40 languages.
- Distributed more than 85,000 pieces of Personal Protection Equipment (Catholic Schools and Parishes)



HEARTS TO SERVE

On March 23rd, 2020, the Archdiocese of Los Angeles launched the Hearts to Serve Hotline in response to the global crisis caused by the COVID-19 Pandemic. The hotline has received over 2,000 calls. As of March 21, 2021, the hotline has provided direct service to over 1,000 individuals with referrals to:



Through the Cardinal McIntyre Fund, the Hearts to Serve program provided \$20,000 in financial assistance to families in need with utility, food, and rental assistance.

The hotline provides a place for individuals throughout the three counties to call and request assistance with resources such as locating a local food pantry, having basic grocery items delivered to homebound seniors, referrals to the Cardinal McIntyre Fund for Charity for financial assistance, housing referrals, and various other needs.

CATHOLIC CHARITIES OF LOS ANGELES

- Provided 568,700 services in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles
- Served 237, 204 families/individuals



CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

- Raised nearly \$9,000,000 to support high-need students to continue their Catholic School education
- Serving over **68,000** students from Pre-Kindergarten to 12th grade
- Over **26K** iPads have been distributed and as a result, there was no disruption in learning.
- **7,500** pieces of sports equipment have been donated by the LA84 Foundation and distributed to our poorest schools to support physical play
- Catholic school campuses reopened in Spring of 2021 across all grade levels
- Catholic school personnel had access to COVID-19 vaccines
- Over 700 doses of the COVID-19 vaccine were administered at LMU vaccine clinic to Catholic school personnel
- Over **85,000 pieces of Personal Protective Equipment** (PPE) distributed to Catholic schools
- Academic performance growth in reading and math in elementary and high schools across the ADLA in the 2020-2021 school year

THE CARDINAL MCINTYRE FUND FOR CHARITY

- 1,096 total individuals/families assisted
- Reimbursed parishes \$1,052,318.47 for financial assistance given to their parishioners
- Of the above amount, \$300,970.67 is directly related to COVID-19 related assistance rent, utilities, funeral expenses for families who have lost a loved one to COVID-19 and financial assistance for those struggling due to loss of work
- Received **COVID-19** designated online donations totaling **\$105,000** and a **\$20,000** grant from the Catholic Campaign for Human Development

Over the past year, The Cardinal McIntyre Fund also gave out grants to parishes and other entities for the following reasons:

- To support the charitable work being done by the Outreach Alliance formed by the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels and St. Francis Center in downtown Los Angeles
- To support Adopt-A-Family's program for providing food, clothing, school needs for the children and other essential household needs to families
- To support St. Camillus Parish Center for special COVID-19 emergencies such as rent, utilities and funeral assistance
- To support the Coalition to Abolish Slavery and Trafficking (CAST), which provides comprehensive services to survivors of human trafficking in Los Angeles




CCHD CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

CCHD Kindness Grants provide support to parishes and assist community partners in serving the most vulnerable throughout Los Angeles, Ventura, and Santa Barbara Counties.

TOTAL GRANTS GIVEN

\$214,622

distributed to parishes, food banks, and community partners providing direct services to support families and individuals in need.







DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

- Raised \$6.4 million to offer emergency support, including tuition assistance and operational funding for our Catholic Schools
- Donors to the COVID-19 Relief Fund contributed \$238,243.35 for individuals and families who needed emergency assistance due to the pandemic
- Clergy members donated an additional \$139,360 for COVID-19 Relief Fund

CATHOLIC CEMETERIES AND MORTUARIES

Our eleven Catholic Cemeteries and six Catholic Mortuaries provided 9,270 interments to grieving families throughout the Archdiocese. An additional six thousand patrons and their families have been protected through our Pre-Planning Programs. The use of online technologies provided opportunities allowing the faithful safe worship and consolation through participation in virtual Memorial Masses, Rosaries, and Prayer Services.









CARING FOR THE WHOLE PERSON

Over 1,000 participants in Caring for the Whole Person webinars offered on the following topics:

Grief and Resiliency Psychological First Aid Mental Health Ministry Science and Ethics of Covid Vaccines Homebound Seasonal Series

42 Care Ministers completed training with the Caring for the Whole Person Initiative to implement parish ministries that support individuals and families in end-of-life care and advanced care planning.



MINISTRY TO THE FAMILIES OF INCARCERATED

975 families were assisted with food, financial assistance, and mental health resources. Legal aid and help with funeral services were also provided to a few families.



OFFICE OF RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

- Provides faith formation to over **102,094 people**, Pre-K to Adult
- Forms and accompanies over 900 Parish Catechetical Leaders to lead virtual formation
- 11,000 Households attended the livestreamed 2021 Religious Education Congress
- 1,093 Ministers (Directors of Religious Education, Youth and Young Adult Ministers, Catechists) attending ORE Faith Formation Programs
- 1,185 Parish Catechetical Leaders participated in Regional Congresses
