2. TALK

Gather your family around for a conversation about royalty, and ask the following question:

What are some of the characteristics of people who are considered to be royalty?

Remembering the Gospel for today, what made Pilate call Jesus a king? What kind of power did Jesus have to give that idea?

Share with us how you are living out your faith at home. Use #LACatholicsBelieve and tag @LACatholics on social media.

One adult in the family can speak briefly about how Catholic Christians understand royalty from the perspective of Jesus: as a way to serve, not be powerful; as a way to love others, not fear them; as a way of giving without expectation, not as a privilege.

Ask all to answer these questions:

- How can each of us honor Jesus as our king with our lives?
- In which ways can we witness to others the kingship of Jesus?

Optional activity for small children: Download the <u>crown</u> <u>template</u> and ask your small children to cut and color the crown, and then write words or draw images that show how they can be examples of Christ's love to others.

3. PRAY

Listen to the song <u>"King of Kings</u>" (by Hillsong) while at the same time looking at the image below.



As you pray with the song and this image, how is Jesus, the King of kings, inviting you to be a witness of his love to others?

End this moment together by reciting the "Glory be..."
