2. PRAY

In today's Gospel we hear the story of Jesus in the temple. We witness the deep love and devotion of Mary and Joseph for Jesus as they journey back to Jerusalem in search of Jesus. We hear this same reading on the Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, which reminds us of the perfect love of our Blessed Mother Mary.

Consider praying with the last stance of the Gospel:

He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them;

and his mother kept all these things in her heart. And Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man.
