2. PRAY

Jesus asked Peter three times if he was willing to follow him.

Gather as a family and observe a minute of silence. Then, like Peter, repeat in prayer: "Lord, you know everything, you know that I love you."

Simon Peter... jumped into the water. Think of some difficulty you are going through right now. Talk to Jesus and put your life, your fears, your desires, your sins, your lack of strength in his hands...



For children: On a sheet of paper, draw what scares you, what makes you sad, or what separates you from Jesus. Then, write this sentence on the sheet: "Jesus, I entrust everything into your hands." When finished, share the drawing with your family.

3. TALK

If today you heard the Lord asking, "Do you love me more than those who work with you, more than your brothers, more than your classmates, more than your own life...?" what would your answer be? Share your answer with someone in your family.

Think of an action you can do this week to make your love for Jesus known in your community, among your family members, your colleagues, your friends. On a piece of paper write: "**Our Family Action Plan.**" All family members write their action on this piece of paper and place it in a visible place in the house (for example, on the refrigerator door) as a reminder of their family plan for this week.
