## 1. HEAR

# 2. PRAY

As a family, gather together and sit quietly. Each member of the family invites the Holy Spirit into his/her heart with their own words. Next, take turns reading out loud a section of the Sequence.

Come, Holy Spirit, come! And from your celestial home shed a ray of light divine! You, of comforters the best; you, the soul's most welcome guest.

Sweet refreshment here below; In our labor, rest most sweet; Grateful coolness in the heat; O most blessed Light divine,

# 3. TALK

One parent or adult asks the questions below, according to the age level:

- 1. **For adults**, pose these two questions: Can you think of a moment or a time when you felt the action of the Holy Spirit moving in you? What were the fruits of that movement of the Holy Spirit you experienced?
- 2. **For small children**, pose this question: Can you think of a time when you felt close to God? *Then, ask them to draw their answer and share it with the group.*
- 3. **For young people**, pose this question: Can you identify a time when you felt moved to do something good for someone else? *Next, invite them to share what they did, if they feel comfortable.*

Reflecting on St. Paul's words in the second reading, as a family will make an effort this week to be aware of the action of the Holy Spirit working in our lives.
