1. HEAR

2. PRAY

After listening to the proclamation of the Gospel, find a place in your home where all can be together to continue with the reflection process.

Invite all to think about a moment in their life when they felt comforted and cared for, and to bring to mind that moment.

Share with us how you are living out your faith at home. Use #LACatholicsBelieve and tag @LACatholics on social media.

One parent/adult may ask the following questions: What emotions did you feel? What memories are in your heart from that moment? Take a minute of silence to relish in that moment. If you have small children, ask them to draw a moment when they feel loved and cared for, and have them share their drawing with the rest of the family.

Next, [listen to the song "Like a Child Rests"](#) on any device you have available (by Christopher Walker, cover by Chris Brunelle, YouTube, 2:18 min.).



After the song has played, invite all to sit quietly and imagine themselves resting in God's arms... Invite each person to take the time to simply let God hold them, love them, and care for them... When all have had time to reflect and all are ready, take turns giving thanks to God for this time together.

3. TALK

Invite each person to reflect on the following questions:

1. How are you demonstrating hospitality to the people around you? Your parents, your siblings, your extended family, your neighbors, your friends, etc. For small children, you may ask them to act out their answer for the family.
2. How is God inviting you to bring peace and healing to others? Where is God calling you to do this? Allow time for each person to think about their answer and then share with the rest of the family.

Close this time of prayer by reciting together the Our Father.
