

What and Who is a Catechist

The whole Christian community is responsible for the ministry of catechesis...

A Catechist is a Christian who receives a particular calling from God that, when accepted in faith, empowers them for the service of the transmission of faith and for the task of initiating others in the Christian life.

By the virtue of faith and baptismal anointing, in collaboration with the Magisterium of Christ and as a servant of the action of the Holy Spirit, the catechists is:

- A witness of faith and keeper of the memory of God
- A teacher and a mystagogue
- An accompanier and educator of those who are entrusted to them by the Church.

WHAT IS BASIC CERTIFICATION?

Basic Certification is a process through which a person gains the basic knowledge and skills to communicate effectively the basic Christian message.

The bishops of the California Catholic Conference have established criteria to promote and standardize the competence of catechetical programs. The Ministry Formation Program offered throughout the Archdiocese of Los Angeles implements these guidelines of the California bishops. It is called “formation”, for its object is not primarily to develop skills, but to assist the person to grow and develop as a proclaimer of the message of Jesus Christ through his Church.

The Catechist Certificate is recognized by all dioceses in the state of California.



The bishop shares his teaching ministry with those whom he formally commissions as catechists, calling them to service of the word as proclaimers of the message of Jesus Christ through his Church.

HOW TO OBTAIN CATECHIST CERTIFICATION

ONE MISSION ONE FAITH—OMOF—THEOLOGY PHASE I

One Mission One Faith is a basic ministry formation process for anyone who serves in the life of the Church. The goal of One Mission One Faith is growth as a missionary disciple of Jesus Christ and formation as a parish minister through an accompaniment model. Participants will ground their ministry in a deeper understanding and intentional living of their Catholic faith.

VISION AND SKILLS FOR FAITH FORMATION PHASE II

Vision and Skills for Faith Formation (formerly known as Specializations) is offered in a 7-week training opportunity that equips faith formation leaders with the knowledge and skills to be witnesses to the faith and accompany adults, families, children, youth, and young adults in their journey of missionary discipleship

PRACTICUM PHASE III

Once the two first phases have been completed the catechist needs to:

- ⇒ Do two observations to experience and be enriched by other certified catechists.
- ⇒ Be evaluated by a certified catechist.
- ⇒ Be recommended by Pastor, Parish Catechetical Leader or master catechist.

Who can take this Formation?

The Catholic Church is a tapestry of many peoples and cultures with a common thread joining us as one: one mission to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ and one Catholic faith to be believed, celebrated, and lived. *One Mission One Faith and Vision and Skills for Faith Formation* are s basic ministry formation processes for anyone who serves in the life of the church .

Their goal is growth as a missionary disciple of Jesus Christ and formation as a parish minister. Participants will ground their ministry in a deeper understanding and intentional living of their Catholic Faith.

Ongoing Formation

The re-certification process enables catechists to renew their certification status after the initial three-year period. Thirty (30) hours of on going faith formation at different levels of education during those three years is required for re-certification.

These hours are accumulated by attending workshops, seminars, and/or courses related to the required fields given at the time of certification.

It is the responsibility of the catechist to record hours on a *Recertification Form* and submit it to the Office of Religious Education. A catechist is re-certified for a three-year period when the Office of Religious Education has received notice of the required number of hours.
