1. HEAR

2. PRAY

An examination of conscience is a prayer practice that Catholics use to reflect on their day, their actions, or to prepare for



confession. In verse 21 Jesus says "Whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves me. And whoever loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and reveal myself to him." The commandments are more than just rules, they are an invitation to love.

Share with us how you are living out your faith at home. Use #LACatholicsBelieve and tag @LACatholics on social media.

For this prayer time we invite you to pray an examination of conscience based on the commandments. Begin with the Sign of the Cross. Take three deep breaths. Reflect on the following questions...Have I accepted the invitation to love my mother? My father? My romantic partner? My neighbor? Strangers? My self? God?

Because God knows our thoughts, talk with God about what came up during your prayer reflection.

How can I show love today?

3. TALK

In the second reading, verse 15 Peter tells early Christians "Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope"

Please share with your family or group what is a reason for your hope?
