HISTORIC CAMPAIGN RAISES MORE THAN \$552 MILLION

As of August 2023, *Called to Renew* has raised more than \$552 million in cash and pledges, and we are deeply grateful to all who helped make *Called to Renew* a resounding success.

Called to Renew relied on a parish-centric approach. Each parish was assigned a goal that was 130% of their 2017 offertory to ensure equal opportunity for success. Pastors collaborated with campaign directors and volunteers to develop compelling cases for support, which helped ensure success in achieving their goals. The process empowered parishioners to witness the impact of their own generosity, making them the true beneficiaries of the campaign.

Called to Renew witnessed extraordinary and heartwarming acts of generosity. An anonymous multimillion-dollar pledge inspired others to give at the leadership level; an elderly woman selflessly donated more than \$10,000 from her savings to her parish campaign. After launching the campaign, Archbishop Gomez led by example, inviting fellow bishops, priests, and faithful Catholics to join him in pledging their support. The response was tremendous, with 298 priests and 170 deacons contributing, and more than 65,000 families showing their love for their parish through heartfelt contributions.

Clergy rally behind *Called to Renew*

A cornerstone of *Called to Renew* was inviting all members of the Archdiocese — including our dedicated clergy — to support our efforts to renew the Church. Together, priests and deacons pledged \$4.4 million to the campaign. Their generosity underscores the importance of *Called to Renew* to the ordained men who have chosen to dedicate their lives to serving us and the Church.

Many of the 298 priests who pledged \$2,724,943 to the mission and future of the Archdiocese extended their generosity beyond the parishes they shepherd. Their commitment reflects their devotion to building God's kingdom here on earth.

Deacons also played an integral role in *Called to Renew's* success, with 170 deacons pledging \$1,706,500. These contributions exemplify their faithfulness as a servant of Christ.

To mark the 250th anniversary of the founding of Mission San Gabriel Arcángel by St. Junipero Serra, Archbishop Gomez called on the faithful of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles to celebrate Forward in Mission, a Jubilee Year from September 11, 2021, to September 10, 2022. Mission San Gabriel Arcángel was the first church in what is now the Archdiocese of Los Angeles.

2022 PRIORITIES

Ministry of Educational Advancement: Catholic School Development

The Department of Catholic Schools has prioritized its efforts in three critical areas:

1. Amplify academic quality and advance Catholic identity for students.

2. Invest in systems and structures to strengthen operational vitality in schools.

3. Develop resources to sustain and form school leaders and teachers.

We saw accomplishments in all three priorities, including, but not limited to:

- Secured \$7.5M in support to increase the base pay of 945 teachers and principals in 91 schools serving high-need students.
 - Improved teacher vacancy rate from 53% to 83%!
 - Increased the retention rate for teachers to 86% and to 99% for principals.
- Achieved debt forgiveness to the Archdiocese for 111 schools.
- Started implementing a system-wide online accounting system.
- Established the first Chief of Mission and Catholic Identity to focus on amplifying faith formation in our schools.
- Expanded opportunities for early college (dual enrollment with partner universities), reaching more than 400 high school students.
- Invested in marketing campaigns for new teachers and students.

These achievements underscore our dedication to comprehensive education and point to a promising future for our schools.



BY THE NUMBERS
