1. HEAR

2. PRAY

In the second reading, the apostle John reminds us that if we truly live by the word of Jesus, we could ask for whatever we want, and it will be done for us. Sometimes we pray for things we want personally, we pray for the needs of others, and for those we don't know but deserve the promises of God.

Listen to the following song by clicking here (YouTube, channel servantofthelion, 3:04 min). As you listen, ask Jesus where you are called to be of service to others. Is there a special situation in your life where this is true?

Close this time of prayer by reciting together: A Servant's Heart (By C.S. Lewis Institute).

3. TALK

In today's Gospel Jesus tells us he is the true vine, the source of life that provides nourishment for our spirits. We as disciples are the branches that cannot stand alone and must witness with our actions the message of Jesus. The more we witness the faith to others, the more God will help us to love others like Jesus. This is not an easy task! It is only possible if we remain in Jesus. How do we remain in Jesus? Take a moment to think about this. We hear Jesus say, "without me you can do nothing". Pair with another person and share ways in which you rely on the words of Jesus for inspiration to find ways to serve others. *Optional: if you* have small children, have them draw or paint their answer. Share with the group your answers, or any art that was created.

Challenge of the week: write down 3 acts of service you can perform for someone close to you, such as a family member, a friend, a neighbor, etc.
