

2. PRAY 3. TALK

Gather with your family or a friend.

In the first reading, David had the opportunity to hurt Saul, but he showed him mercy instead. Mercy means "compassion or forgiveness shown toward someone whom it is within one's power to punish or harm" Let us pray that we can model this kindness and mercy as we need to forgive those who have hurt us.

In the gospel, Jesus tells us to do for others as you would have them do to you. Let us bring this to prayer asking the Holy Spirit to open our minds and hearts to see the needs of others and share generously. May we be a sign of God's love and mercy to those around us.
