### 1. HEAR

Grab your bible and look up the Gospel reading. Don't have one? No worries you can find the Gospel reading by clicking HERE. (Bishop O'Connell's Gospel Reflection page.)

#### 2. PRAY

In today's Gospel, Jesus sends the seventy-two on mission. He sends them in pairs and gives them directions on what to take, where to stay, and what to do. Some might be sent to places nearby; others sent a great distance.

Begin your prayer asking God to speak to you through your imagination. Slowly read the Gospel again. Imagine that Jesus is talking to you, sending you out on mission. Take your time and let the scene come to life. Where is Jesus sending you? How does he want you to interact with those whom you encounter? What does he want you to say and do? Who is he sending with you? As you listen to Jesus, what feelings or questions are stirring in you?

What are you thinking about? What is your response to Jesus? Tell him about all these things and anything else that is in your heart.

When you are ready, thank Jesus for your time together. Close your prayer by praying, *Glory be...* 



## 3. TALK

Share with your family or a close friend about the following:

- How do you typically prepare for a journey? What arrangements do you make? What do you pack?
- When Jesus sent the seventy-two, he told them to take nothing with them. What would it be like to set out on short notice, without prior arrangements, and leaving everything behind?
- At the end of every Mass, we are sent to "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord;" or to "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life." This Sunday when you hear this invitation reflect on, how is Jesus inviting you to live out this mission this week?
- The main preparation the seventy-two had for their mission was their own personal experience of Jesus and what they learned from him. How have you experienced Jesus or what have you learned from him that has prepared you for what he is inviting you to do this week?
