## 1. HEAR

# 2. PRAY

### Gather your family in your prayer space.

Start by reading the First Reading again. It is a prayer of lament/sadness, but it also reminds us that God always brings us comfort and hope.

After the reading, invite each person to share what they are feeling or thinking. Everyone should listen with kindness and respect—no judging, just being present for one another.

After each person has shared, spend a quiet moment together to let God's love and peace fill your hearts.

Finish your prayer time by praying the **Our Father** together.

# 3. TALK

The apostles asked Jesus, "Lord, increase our faith." Jesus replied that even a tiny amount of true faith can accomplish amazing things. He said that if their faith were as small as a mustard seed, they could tell a mulberry tree, "Be uprooted and planted in the sea," and it would obey.

He went on to explain that, like faithful servants who simply do their duty, we should serve God with humility. We do not serve to earn praise, but to fulfill what God calls us to do.

Invite each person to share following questions:

- What is the unmovable place of my faith that can be moved to a new space?
- What holds me back?
- What can I move with my faith?
